Quota International of Toowoomba Project Name: QuoCKa Launch



Project Description:

Our QuoCKa reading program has been running at Darling Heights State School in Toowoomba for the past three years in the Prep grades. DHSS has 49 nationalities with 51 languages in its school population with a high percentage of migrant and refugee children from Syria, Iraq, Iran, Afghanistan, Sudan, Ethiopia, Egypt and Kenya.

The local Crime Prevention unit of Toowoomba Police has guided our selection of QuoCKa schools over the past 7 years - we go where they are keen to improve relationships particularly with younger students.

Community policing demands on police have often meant that they cannot make weekly QuoCka reading sessions - they have always been there for QuoCKa Launch days, school Harmony days and special functions at the school. Our young students swarm all over them - asking lots of questions, examining their gear and being normal inquisitive kids - surely a great endorsement of a program which has improved relationships and build much trust and harmony!

Quota International of Angeles Project Name: Quota Cares Month

Project Description:

We help the 57 children with special needs. These are the pupils who go to SPed class in Salapungan Elementary School in Angeles City. We surprised the kids on their Recognition Day. During that day we distributed stuff toys and sponsored snacks for pupils.

Sioux City members donated 461 new pairs of children's socks, and 550 new children's underwear to Unity Elementary School in Sioux City, and the Council on Sexual Assault & Domestic Violence (CSADV) Shelter in Sioux City.

This was the first time the Club tried "Seats and Feets". The hope was not only to accomplish good for the community, but also to be a fun and catchy way of introducing what Quota does to make a difference within our community.

Our members (and we believe those made aware of the project) learned that the simplest things, such as NEW socks and underwear can make a huge impact on those who are living at the margins of society.
